

## **Guidelines for submitting to *NEURON Comments***

*Neuron* now publishes readers' *Comments* for all published *Neuron* articles. The goal of the format is to provide readers with a forum to voice your opinions on work that is published in *Neuron*. Online *Comments* are available for any published article in *Neuron* and the online archive, including Research Articles, Reports, Neurotechniques, Primers, Viewpoints, Clinical/Case Studies, Reviews, Minireviews, and Previews.

*Comments* can relate to specific experiments, techniques, or conclusions of the paper or may address broader issues and debates within the field. Does this work relate to your own work? Does the study raise interesting new questions for the field? Are there experiments that you would have wanted to see in the paper or conclusions that you don't agree with? Do you have a different perspective than the one offered by the Review or Preview? For Neurotechniques or Primers, have you modified the technique in a way that you think others might find useful? *Comments* are also useful if you have a question or would like to receive advice from the scientific community on some aspect of a particular technique or approach?

The Editors will screen all *Comments* to ensure that they are relevant and appropriate but they will not be edited in detail, if at all. The final decision on publication of a *Comment* is at the Editors' discretion. *Comments* will reflect the opinions of the authors only, and they are solely responsible for the accuracy of their content.

Additional guidelines:

- Comments* may be critical or positive but should be thoughtful and relevant to the paper.
- Comments* should be concise. The text limit is 10,000 characters (including spaces).
- No figures, tables, attachments, or supplemental files are permitted.
- References may be included if needed but should be kept to a minimum.
- We do not accept anonymous *Comments*—they must be signed and authors' names will be posted with the *Comment*. An e-mail address is required for submitting a *Comment* but it will not be posted, unless the author of the *Comment* includes it in the body of the text.
- Research groups or Journal clubs may also provide group comments with attribution to the university and department.
- *Comments* may be rejected that are considered obscene, libelous, or inappropriate.
